Men's Golf Association

On July 13th, we will be hosting a Pick 6 tournament. The Pick 6 is about picking which holes you want to play different tees. 3 sets of 6, one set from your normal tees, one set from the next tees up and one set from the next tees back. Choose whatever you think will help you make the best score for 18 holes, but in the end, you have to play 6 of each. Example: If you play the Blue tees, you will need to pick 6 green, 6 blue, and 6 gold to complete your round. It is your choice on which holes to play what tees but must play 6 tees up, 6 tees regular, and 6 tees back. Make a strategy and have fun. Registration is available in the Golf Shop. *MGA Notices:*

Rules & Playing Conditions:

We will have 2 playing conditions (PC) depending on weather & course conditions. PC1 & PC2. We will try to have a laminated card dictating the Playing Condition (Rules condition)

for each tournament. If it is not clear to you which Playing Condition is in effect, please ask at the desk or, as a backup, the pro shop. Both conditions will include the following:

1. One ball off of your 1st tee of the round. No breakfast balls. 2. Must putt out each scoring hole unless otherwise specified. 3. Observe Golden Hills rock rule - currently allowing to move the ball away from the rock area (no closer to hole). 4. No free relief from roots.

PC1: Moderate & Good Weather: Roll ball up to one (unfolded) scorecard length in your own fairway (includes shortly cut fringe – reminder that there is no fringe on #17). Play ball as it lies in all other areas of the course.

PC2: Poor/Wet conditions: Roll ball up to one (unfolded) scorecard length through the green (includes rough and sand traps).

Closest to the Pin Markers: When you mark the closest to the pin with your distance to the

pin, please include feet & inches on each, EVEN IF YOU ARE INSIDE OF 1FT. EVEN IF YOU ARE measurable in less than 100 inches, please use the feet AND inches notation. For a shot that is closer than all the most recent measurements on the CTP marker, See the following examples of how to write it down.

8 inches: 0' 8" - Or if there is room to write it out: 0 feet 8 inches; 39 inches: 3' 3" - Or if there is room to write it out: 3 feet 3 inches; 5 feet: 5' 0" - 5 feet and 0 inches

Writing just the number of feet or inches without spelling it out DOES BECOME CON-FUSING and can cost you or other winners money.

HANDICAPS: We continue to manage handicaps for every player. Please exercise patience, common sense and honesty to help us refine and 'perfect' the process.
